OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Our Lady of the Mountains:

WHAT'S IN YOUR WALLET?

It is said, *“Success is easy: Just do the right thing, at the right time, in the right way, and there you have it!”* What can be easier than that?! But, it doesn't *always* happen that way.

A Story: A line formed behind an old man who was slow in using an ATM. Impatiently, someone shouted, *“Hey pop! Unlike you, I don't have all day!!”* The old man was visibly shaken. Just then, a young woman got out of the line, went up to the old man and said, *“Can I help, sir?”* *“Oh, please!”* he said, *“It's my first time using the machine, and I don't think I'm doing it right.”* Calmly, she walked him through the process; the others finished their financial needs, and everyone left happy and satisfied. – Just do the right thing, at the right time, in the right way, and there you have it!

Would you consider a person who gives two pennies to the church collection, as ‘generous’? In last weekend's gospel, while a number of people made large contributions to the temple's needs, Jesus praised a poor widow, who gave only two copper coins. Jesus revealed to us: *“She, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood.”*

Most of us consider our money, *OUR* money – our homes, cars, appliances, businesses, retirement investments, clothes, etc. – to be ‘ours.’ But God wants us to understand – and to remember – that *every-thing* we have – *every-thing* – belongs to Him and is meant as *tools* in helping us to value the importance of helping one another; we are not our own master.

Many of us don't mind giving – we may even *enjoy* giving something to God and others. Nevertheless, we are terrified by the prospect of handing our whole life over to Him. Yet, His grace is sufficient (2 Cor 12:9). The Lord can grace us so much, that we would be ashamed to give Him less than *every-thing*. But we have to start somewhere.

Do you think that most Catholics give a ‘fair share’ of their income to the Church and to charities? It is false. A *Gallup Poll* showed, that the average American Catholic gave (a combined!) only 1.3% of their income to parish *and* to charities! Protestants, gave nearly 2.4%, and Jews – 3.8%! Many people are more generous to *waiters*, than to God! People will give as a tip – 15, 18 or even 20% of their bill. *That is double-tithing!* (They would be embarrassed, if they gave waiters, what they give to God.)

The Lord wants His ‘teachings’ to be understood, *and* to be lived. He deserves much more from us; He deserves our trust, and He deserves our daily expressions of love and esteem. (To be continued)

Crossroads Ministry operates as a Christian service agency, for Estes are residents, providing short term assistance to low income people, ongoing services for people on low fixed incomes, and encourages self-sufficiency through educational opportunities. It partners with other agencies to maximize benefits to clients. All persons are treated equally regardless of age, race or religious belief, country of origin, disability or sexual preference.

In the last 12 months Crossroads served 372 families comprised of 994 individuals, of whom 342 are children. This is 50 more families, 152 more individuals and 19 more children than were served in the 12 months of 2008. Many of the adults were newly unemployed. Crossroads thanks you for your support.
