### **OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Dear Our Lady of the Mountains:

#### **HAPPY THANKSGIVING & WELCOME, CHRIST THE KING!**

**November** is a strange, wonderful time of the year. Trees have lost their leaves, winter snow is becoming more regular, the nights are growing longer – and the holiday ‘hustle and bustle’ has yet to get into full swing. And, it is a month which makes known to us other wonderful experiences and hopes: Thanksgiving (just around the corner), Solemnity of Christ the King (Nov. 22), and Advent (which marks the beginning of the Church’s new liturgical year). All in all, it is a graced time for us to reflect on God providential plan in leading mankind to Salvation; it’s a goo-ood month!!

This Thursday, the U.S. celebrates its national *reminder* and *holiday*, Thanksgiving; what a *great* holiday for a country to have! Now, if you can “get passed” the commercial pressures and hassles of “Black Friday”(the Friday after Thanksgiving) then we can better understand what God is really wanting from us.

For example, earlier this week at daily Mass (Tues., Nov. 17) in the gospel reading, our Lord called out to a man despised by people, a tax-collector, Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus had heard that Jesus was in town and he was very curious to see what Jesus was like. Because Zacchaeus was small in stature, he ran ahead and climbed into the branches of a sycamore tree – to get a better look. And as Jesus passed near the tree, He looked up in Zacchaeus’ direction and said, “Zacchaeus, hurry down. I want to stay in your house today.” - What simple, beautiful words: *I-want-to-stay-in-your-house-today*. It was that ‘**self-invitation**’ which changed Zacchaeus, and which Jesus extends, constantly, to each of us!! “Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If any-one hears my voice and opens the door, then I will enter his house and dine with him and he with me.” (Rev. 3:20).

Of all the people in Jericho, Jesus picks the house of the one person who most everyone regarded as a social and religious *outcast*. As usual, Jesus sees *beyond* the public image we project, to the *real* person that is underneath our rough exteriors. Jesus is always able to see beyond the stereotype, which makes Zacchaeus – or any of us – *outcasts*: “ – I want to stay in your house, today.”

This weekend, the Church is also coming to the ‘year-end’ of its *Liturgical* year. Here, we celebrate the **Solemnity of Christ the King** – a *future* day, when the glory of Jesus’ Second and Final Coming will bring to the world the full meaning, impact and glory of His Death and Resurrection. In both instances - Thanksgiving and Solemnity of Christ the King - let us reach out to the Lord. Tell Him you want to *Thank* Him and to renew your commitment to Him as the Glorious King of your life. Today place yourself, and your family, under His Lordship, His care and His love.
